

Regulations on a Number of Articles Subject to Entry-and-exit Restrictions	
Amsterdam	Non-EU residents can carry, free of duty, 200 cigarettes, or 100 cigarillos, or 50 cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco; 2 liters of alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration under 22 percent, or 1 liter of alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration over 22 percent, and 4 liters of natural still wine and 16 liters of beer.
Auckland	200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco, or a mixture of the above three with the weight not exceeding 250g; three bottles of spirits or other alcoholic beverages, each of which is no more than 1,125 ml; and 4.5 liters of table wine (up to 6 bottles) or beer (up to 12 cans). Passengers can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 700 New Zealand dollars.
Bangkok	200 cigarettes, or 250g of cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco; 1 liter of spirits, and personal items worth no more than 10,000 baht.
Brisbane	250 cigarettes, or 250g of cigars or pipe tobacco; 2.25 liters of wine or spirits. Adults can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 900 Australian dollars in total; and for passengers under 18 years of age, no more than 400 Australian dollars in total.
Delhi	200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco and 2 liters of wine or spirits (each up to 1 liter).
Dubai	400 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco. Non-Muslims can also carry, free of duty, 4 liters of alcoholic beverages or 2 cases of beer, and gifts worth no more than 3000 dirham.
Fukuoka	Non-Japanese tourists can carry, free of duty, 400 Japan-made cigarettes and 400 cigarettes made in non-Japan countries, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco, or a total of 500g of cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco. For Japanese residents, the amount is halved. Three bottles of wine or spirits (760ml per bottle); 2 oz of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than 200,000 yen.
Hanoi	Passengers over 18 years of age can carry, free of duty, 400 cigarettes, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco; 2 liters of spirits with the alcohol concentration under 22 percent, or 1.5 liters of spirits with the alcohol concentration over 22 percent.
Ho Chi Minh City	Passengers over 18 years of age can carry, free of duty, 400 cigarettes, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco; 2 liters of spirits with the alcohol concentration under 22 percent, or 1.5 liters of spirits with the alcohol concentration over 22 percent.
Hong Kong	One liter of alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration, measured by volume at 20 degrees Celsius, over 30%; and 19 cigarettes, or a cigar, or 25g of other manufactured pipe tobacco. Only passengers that are over 18 years of age can carry the above duty-free commodities into Hong Kong, for their own use. Passengers with Hong Kong identity cards must have departed from Hong Kong for at least 24 hours before they can enjoy the duty-free treatment on alcoholic beverages. Note: Table wine or alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration less than 30% are subject to no limitation of duty.
Jakarta	200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 100g of pipe tobacco; and 1 liter of spirits. Adults can each carry, free of duty, gifts worth no more than 250 U.S. dollars, or families can each carry, free of duty, gifts worth no more than 1,000 U.S. dollars in total.
Kuala Lumpur	Passengers who have travelled abroad for more than 72 hours and will stay in Malaysia for more than 75 hours can carry, free of duty, 200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 225g of pipe tobacco; 1 liter of wine or spirits, and articles worth no more than 200 ringgit in total.

Los Angeles	200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 2kg of pipe tobacco; Passengers over 21 years of age can carry, free of duty, 1 liter of alcoholic beverages. U.S. residents can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 800 U.S. dollars in total; and non-US residents, no more than 100 U.S. dollars.
Manila	400 cigarettes, or 50g of cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco, and 2 bottles of wine or spirits (up to 1 liter per bottle). Tax-free allowance for each passenger is granted only once a year.
Melbourne	250 cigarettes, or 250g of cigars or pipe tobacco; and 2.25 liters of wine or spirits. Adults can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 900 Australian dollars in total; and passengers under 18 years of age, no more than 450 Australian dollars in total.
Moscow	Two liters of alcoholic beverages (by passengers over 21 years of age only); 200 cigarettes, 100 cigarillos, 50 cigars and 250g of pipe tobacco (if the passenger carries the same type of pipe tobacco, then his or her limit will be doubled); and 250g of caviar.
Nagoya	Non-Japanese tourists can carry, free of duty, 400 Japan-made cigarettes and 400 cigarettes made in non-Japan countries, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco, or a total of 500g of cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco. For Japanese residents, the amount is halved. Three bottles of wine or spirits (760ml per bottle); 2 oz of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than 200,000 yen.
Osaka	Non-Japanese tourists can carry, free of duty, 400 Japan-made cigarettes and 400 cigarettes made in non-Japan countries, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco, or a total of 500g of cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco. For Japanese residents, the amount is halved. Three bottles of wine or spirits (760ml per bottle); 2 oz of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than 200,000 yen.
Paris	Non-EU residents can carry, free of duty, 200 cigarettes, or 100 cigarillos, or 50 cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco; 2 liters of alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration under 22 percent, or 1 liter of alcoholic beverages with the alcohol concentration over 22 percent, and 4 liters of natural still wine and 16 liters of beer.
Penang	Passengers who have travelled abroad for more than 72 hours and will stay in Malaysia for more than 75 hours can carry, free of duty, 200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 225g of pipe tobacco; 1 liter of wine or spirits, and articles worth no more than 200 ringgit in total.
Perth	250 cigarettes, or 250g of cigars or pipe tobacco; and 2.25 liters of wine or spirits. Adults can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 900 Australian dollars in total; and passengers under 18 years of age, no more than 450 Australian dollars in total.
Sapporo	Non-Japanese tourists can carry, free of duty, 400 Japan-made cigarettes and 400 cigarettes made in non-Japan countries, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco, or a total of 500g of cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco. For Japanese residents, the amount is halved. Three bottles of wine or spirits (760ml per bottle); 2 oz of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than 200,000 yen.
Seoul	200 cigarettes, or 50g of cigars, or 250g of pipe tobacco (by passengers over 19 years of age only); and 1 liter of alcoholic beverages (by passengers over 20 years of age only), and gifts worth no more than 400 U.S. dollars, and 2 oz of cologne.
Singapore	Cigarettes of any kind should be declared when passengers are entering into Singapore. Passengers who have left Singapore for more than 48 hours can carry, free of duty, 1 liter of wine, 1 liter of spirits and 1 liter of beer.

Sydney	250 cigarettes, or 250g of cigars or pipe tobacco; and 2.25 liters of wine or spirits. Adults can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 900 Australian dollars in total; and passengers under 18 years of age, no more than 450 Australian dollars in total.
Taipei	200 cigarettes, or 25 cigars, or 1 pound of pipe tobacco; 1 bottle of wine or spirits no more than 1 liter; a moderate amount of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than NTD 20,000 in total.
Tokyo	Non-Japanese tourists can carry, free of duty, 400 Japan-made cigarettes and 400 cigarettes made in non-Japan countries, or 100 cigars, or 500g of pipe tobacco, or a total of 500g of cigarettes, cigars and pipe tobacco. For Japanese residents, the amount is halved. Three bottles of wine or spirits (760ml per bottle); 2 oz of perfume, and, free of duty, articles worth no more than 200,000 yen.
Vancouver	Passengers who have left Canada for more than 48 hours can carry, free of duty, 200 cigarettes, or 50 cigars, or 200g of pipe tobacco; 1.14 liters of spirits, or 1.5 liter of wine, or 24 cans of 355ml beer; a moderate amount of perfume, and articles worth no more than 450 Canadian dollars. Passengers who have left Canada for more than 7 days can carry, free of duty, gifts worth no more than 750 Canadian dollars. Passengers who have left Canada for more than 24 hours can carry, free of duty, articles worth no more than 50 Canadian dollars.
